

**E8 – TEMPORARY STAY VISA FOR SAZONAL WORK (WITH A DURATION OF MORE THAN 90 DAYS)**

Sr.No	Types Of Documents	Remarks	Yes	No
1.	<b>Visa Application Form</b>	Completely filled and signed by the applicant.		
2.	<b>Valid Passport</b>	The Passport should be valid for at least three months (any another type of travel document should be valid for at least six months), beyond the intended duration of stay in the Schengen territory and with at least two blank pages to affix the visa. No visa will be issued on the additional page of the passport. Previous passport, if any, should also, be submitted with the visa application.		
3.	<b>2 Colour photographs</b>	Two identical passport photographs, up-to-date and in good condition, allowing the proper identification.		
4.	<b>Travel Reservation</b>	Travel reservation ensuring the return of the applicant to the home country.		
5.	<b>Travel Insurance</b>	Valid travel insurance covering necessary medical expenses, including emergency assistance and repatriation.		
6.	<b>Medical Insurance</b>	Valid medical insurance against accidents, provided by the working company.		
7.	<b>SEF</b>	A form authorizing access to Portuguese criminal record consultation by the Immigration and Border Services (Serviço de Estrangeiros e Fronteiras–SEF).		
8.	<b>PCC (Police clearance certificate)</b>	Police Clearance certificate from the applicant's country of origin or country of residence for over one year – the A police Clearance certificate is only considered valid up to three months after the date of issuance. Older PCC's will not be accepted. (PCC should be Apostole from MEA).		
9.	<b>Accommodation Proof</b>	Proof of accommodation as such a hotel , hostel, apartment etc.		
10.	<b>Work contract</b>	Valid work offer for seasonal work purposes, with a temporary work company or an employer established in Portugal, identifying the location, time, type of work, as well as duration, salary and paid vacation.		
9.	<b>Work Activity Registration</b>	The work activity must be registered in the list of work sectors for which seasonal work is available, defined by the Portuguese Government: 1) Agriculture, livestock, hunting, forestry and fishing. 2) Housing, hotel and restaurant industries. 3) Food, drinks and tobacco industries. 4) Wholesale and Retail commerce. 5) Construction industries. 6) Land transports (drivers must show proof that they are allowed to perform driving duties in Portugal – such as international driving license).		

Note: (1) The applicant could be asked for additional documents or may be called for an Interview if desired by the Embassy of Portugal (2) Carry all documents in original at the time of interview. (3) National visas require consultation of one or more authorities in Portugal, therefore the Embassy and those authorities require at least 30 working days after the visa is submitted or after interview (if the same is requested by the Embassy) to process the visa application.
