The education system in Portugal:

Portugal is innovation destination for higher education. At present, higher education in Portugal is divided into two subsystems: university education and non-university higher education (polytechnic education), and it is provided in public and private universities and non-university higher education institutions (both public and private). It consists of a European education frame.

In addition, enter college or university in Portugal must have a tenth or twelve years of schooling education. Portugal higher education teaches in local languages (Portuguese) and International others I languages as such English, German, and French.

Program:

Professional courses (Certificate) diploma, pre-semester, first circle degrees (Bachelor), second circle degrees (Master) third circle (PhD) in multi esteem.

Universities:

Portugal education system controlled by the government and issued accreditation to state universities and private institution to provide quality of education. A few independent institutions also offer world rage of education in Portugal.

Admission days:

Admission: April to August for September intake each year

Admission: October to January for February intake each year

Admission Process:

In order to enrol with Portuguese educational institutes follow below steps:

1. Email documents:
Passport copy and previews visa copies
Educational documents 10th onwards
Experiences documents (if have)
IELTS score card or equal documents
Updated CV
2. After assessment and confirmation from university, if eligible, we/ university will issue an invoice for registration and application fees of 200-250 Euros.
3. Process application for enrolment to university.
4. Transfer enrollment fees 300-500 Euro.
5. We/University issued a final acceptance letter with visa support documents as such insurance, accommodation, guarantee letter proof, etc.

Please note all above process takes around 30-45 working days and application and enrolment fees are nonrefundable.



STUDY IN PORTUGAL

Visa Process:

In order to process the visa application in your country/region, you must have the following documents along with your Portuguese visa application form to study in Portugal, you will also need to have gained prior acceptance onto a course at a Portuguese university or place of higher education some embassies/consulates may also request a criminal record certificate if your study in Portugal lasts longer than 90 days, you will need to show:

- valid passport/travel ID
- two current passport photographs
- valid visa (if required)
- valid academic documents should be HRD and apostle from concern authorities
- proof of financial resources
- proof of accommodation
- criminal record certificate
- proof of enrolment at the place of study
- proof of payment of tuition fees, where applicable
- medical/travel insurance.
- some embassies/consulates may also request a criminal record certificate.

Tuition Fees:

Average costs of studying at a Public University and Private University in Portugal are; depending on the types of program and years:

- Bachelor's and Master's: 3000 EUR – 7,000 EUR per year
- PhDs: 2,500 – 4, 000 EUR per year

Students enrolled in a part-time program at a public university in Portugal should expect to pay about 70% of the fees a full-time student would pay, and exchange students may be exempt from paying tuition fees depending on the agreement made with their home university.

Scholarship and grants for study:

There are several government-funded grants and scholarships available to both EU and non-EU students wanting to study at a university in Portugal. To be eligible for one of these, you must be enrolled at a university that is recognized by the Portuguese Ministry of Education. Scholarships and grants are usually offered to Master's students, however, this is not exclusively the case – financial support for Bachelor's degrees are available, as well as internships from foundations and research institutions.



STUDY IN PORTUGAL

Cost of Living/Food/Transportation

Portugal is a highly affordable country having chief accommodations, food, and transportations between 350 EUR – 400 EUR.

Additional Fees:

Embassy fees, medical/insurance fees, flight booking, accommodation, pre and post landing services, consultancy fees, miscellaneous fees.

(Note: the additional fees are 1,500 – 2,000 EUR depending on the kind of services you wish to avail.)

Work Permit:

Working in Portugal while you're a student

Non-EU students on Portuguese student visa and residence permits are allowed to work in Portugal subject to authorization from the SEF. You can also request permission to undertake research work, academic teaching or engage in highly qualified activities provided you have the necessary skills and qualifications. There are also permits available for unpaid trainees and volunteers. If you want to volunteer or undertake an unpaid internship or training position, your employer will need to contact the SEF to inquire about getting the necessary permit. EU students can work in Portugal without requiring a work permit.

Working in Portugal after completing your study

Non-EU nationals who want to stay on after their Portuguese student visa expires will need to have an offer of suitable employment to extend their residence. Their permit will need to be changed to a residence permit for employed workers, research workers and highly qualified professionals, or self-employed workers. You can also apply for the EU Blue Card which is available for highly qualified workers from non-EU/EFTA countries if they wish to work in the EU.



STUDY IN PORTUGAL

Resettlement options:

The student has a wide range of opportunities after completing their studies. They have the option to go back or stay back if they want to work in and acquire the resident card. A residence permit, if they plan to work in Portugal for long-term. The type of residence permit you need will depend on the basis of your employment. There is an also option of blue card and golden visa, in case if you wish to avail as per the norms and suitability.
